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## Assignment #3: Photography Expert Report.

Objective:

- Using the reference resources at the Wallace Library Building an 8 - 16 image Power Point presentation with text and images. At the beginning of the presentation have a title page with your name, class and section listed, as well as the topic or title of your presentation and an image. The last slide should be your reference slide using APA standards.

Field Trip:

We will take a field trip to visit the library and meet with Kari Horowicz at Wallace Library Building.

Procedure:

Using the information discussed during field trip with Kari Horowicz.

The topic of the essay is “The Beginning of Digital Photography.”

1. Look up a photographer or topic of your choice that pertains to the topics of early digital photography.
2. Try and find a .jpg images to illustrate your essay.
3. Give a brief description or historical fact about the topic, process, equipment or photographer.
4. To do this research paper, you must pull reference from at least two of the following resources.
  - A. Library book shelves.
  - B. Magazines or periodicals.
  - C. The Internet.
  - D. Another source discussed during our field trip.
5. Your PowerPoint Presentation will have to be presented in class during lab on 9/30/2010.

Document Requirements:

Your document (excluding the title page and bibliography) should be at least 8 slides. Please use a word processing program with a spelling and grammar check. AND please don't forget to proof-read your finished document! Think quality, not quantity after the minimum is met.

- Concerning the .jpg images for the presentation,  
For a horizontal image, no larger than 800 pixels wide x 600 pixels high X 150 ppi resolution.  
For a vertical image, no larger than 600 pixels high x 600 pixels wide x 150 ppi resolution.  
Medium compression.  
Can be RGB or gray scale.
- The Power Point Presentation must be at least 10 cells.
- Your name and contact information must be at the beginning of the presentation.
- The title of your topic must be at the beginning of the presentation.
- Your references must be at the end of the presentation.

- Keep text to a minimum and consistent font and colors.
- Keep images large and interesting when working with text.
- Provide an assessment document with the project.

Nothing will be accepted past this time.
